GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF TASK(S) AND OBJECTIVES TO BE ACHIEVED

Background:

The Global Environment Facility (GEF) approved in June 2012 the concept note of the project titled 'Improving Forest and Protected Area Management in Trinidad and Tobago'. It intends to conserve biodiversity in Trinidad and Tobago by consolidating the protected area system and enhancing capacity and finance for conservation management. Subsequently, GEF approved a project preparation grant of US\$119,000 in September 2012. The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) is currently developing the full project document, in collaboration with relevant departments in Trinidad and Tobago and in consultation with diverse stakeholders for submission to GEF by August 2013 for endorsement.

This consultancy's purpose is to study in detail various technical aspects of the project and provide inputs to design the project components as proposed in the Project Identification Form, and as agreed with the stakeholders at the Inception Workshop in Trinidad and Tobago during 31 October- 01 November 2012. The key results of the consultant's activities will provide the project's baseline data and constitute the foundation for developing the project document.

Tasks:

Under the general supervision of the FAO Country Representative (Trinidad and Tobago), the technical supervision of Forestry Officer (Economics), FAO (Rome), and in close collaboration with other consultants and national counterparts, the consultant will do the following tasks.

- Conduct literature review, identify gaps in PA network and biodiversity conservation in Trinidad and Tobago and propose a draft national
- Evaluate proposed PAs, validate their selection and classify them.
- Estimate abundance and distribution of key species in PAs, prioritize the species to be targeted and propose plans to stabilize their population and enrich habitats in proposed PAs.
- Assess the improvement needs through surveys among PA staff and propose the ways to increase management effectiveness.
- Fill out the GEF tracking tools in consultation with other consultants and key officials.
- Identify and prioritize threats to biodiversity conservation and barriers to effective PA management and propose measures to address
- Estimate the global and national environmental benefits of the project
- Identify capacity development needs in biodiversity and PA management and present a development plan.
- Engage with various stakeholders and organize consultations/workshops and prepare workshop reports.
- Prepare brief reports on every project site in the agreed format.
- Along with the Expert in Legal and Institutional Reform, suggest governance arrangements for the proposed project sites.
- Prepare thematic and collaborative reports related to various aspects of the project.
- Provide the baseline data, maps etc needed for the project document.
- Work with the Environmental Economist to estimate the annual expenditure needed for PA management.
- In collaboration other consultants, assess the implementation capacity of the project and propose the ways to improve.
- Design the project component 1: Improvements in the legal and institutional arrangements for PA management; and Component 2: Improvements to infrastructure for biodiversity conservation and forest restoration and provide their split up costs.
- Organize a terminal workshop, present the draft project document to stakeholders and submit a detailed workshop report.
- Coordinate the work of other consultants, help them to ensure the deliverables, prepare progress reports and liaise with all other experts, FAO, various departments and stakeholders to successfully complete all planned activities to develop the four components in the project.
- Perform all other related tasks essential for preparing the project document.
