National Technical Advisor - One Health Zoonoses Control

The National Technical Advisor - One Health Zoonoses Control (NTA - OH Zoonoses Control) shall work under the overall supervision of the FAO Country Representative, the technical supervision of the Team Leader of the FAO ECTAD Programme in Indonesia and the day-to-day technical supervision of the ECTAD National Technical Adviser – One Health Capacity Building. Furthermore, the incumbent will work in close collaboration with the Rapid Response Unit (RRU) and relevant sub-directorates of the Directorate of Animal Health (DAH), the Directorate of Veterinary Public Health, Directorate General of Livestock and Animal Health Services, as well as other national authorities, FAO technical staff, particularly the ECTAD Chief Technical Adviser (CTA) and Senior National Veterinary Adviser (SNVA), and other agencies responsible for the control of emerging infectious diseases (EID), zoonoses and pandemic threats in Indonesia.

Specific responsibilities will include:

- Support the establishment of One Health linkages between MOA, MOH, and the National Commission for Zoonoses Control (KomNas Zoonosis) to control zoonoses and EIDs;
- Support the development of training materials including SOPs, modules, and curriculum for GOI to early detect, control and prevent targeted zoonoses and EIDs;
- Support the implementation of training programmes for GOI, in particular on the integrated One Health approach in disease outbreak investigation;
- Support capacity building for epidemiological analysis of field data at the district level;
- Support the development and review of communication material to support zoonoses and EID prevention and control;
- Support the Output B team leader to monitor progress against the work plan by tracking activities and targets with periodical review and revision;
- Assist the Output B team leader and SNVA to liaise with the DAH and the DAH Rapid Response Unit (*Unit Respons Cepat* – URC) and relevant Sub-directorates on programme development and maintenance of quality;
- Assist the Output B team leader to coordinate with the communication team on the development of communication materials;
- Provide inputs for FAO and donor reports;
- Participate and provide inputs in annual project planning activities;
- Submit an End of Assignment report by 15th September 2016, covering the last 12 months of work;
- Perform other related duties as requested.

Expected Output:

- Establishment of strong contacts and working arrangements with appropriate staff at the MoA, MoH, National Commission for Zoonoses Control, other related Ministries, and local government.

- Strengthened technical capacity of GOI to detect and control zoonoses and EIDs using the One Health approach.
Required completion date: ongoing and as required
- Strengthened GOI capacity to develop SOPs, training modules, and IEC materials to implement targeted zoonoses and EIDs control.

- Provision of epidemiological analysis on collected field disease outbreak data.
Required completion date: ongoing and as required
- End of Assignment report submitted.

Academic Qualifications:

- Veterinary or human health medical qualification (field epidemiology background), with minimum 5 years field experience.

Technical Competencies and Experience Requirements:

- Veterinary medicine or human medicine experience with field epidemiology background (FETP/FETPV).
- Experience in working with Government of Indonesia local administrations at provincial, district and sub-district level.
- Experience in participatory training methods, and developing and assessing training material.
- Experience in working in multiple sectors.
- Knowledge of Indonesian livestock systems.
- Experience with disease detection and control of zoonoses and emerging infectious diseases (EIDs).
- Experience with disease outbreak investigations.
- Experience with syndromic and/or event based surveillance.
- Experience with One Health approaches.
- Proficiency in both written and spoken in English is required.

Duration: 3 months initial contract with possibility of further extension subjects to satisfactory performance and availability of funding.
