Project Inception Report Consultant- Sinabung

The 2013 Sinabung volcanic eruption in Karo District of North Sumatra had displaced as many as 29,834 people or 9,364 households from 34 villages of four sub-districts within Karo District and hosted in 42 displacement centres (OCHA report, as per 30 January 2014). The eruption has mostly affected agricultural sector where farmers suffered the biggest loss. The loss of income was related to the damage of farmlands that cannot be cultivated or required land major clearing. As a response to the livelihoods recovery needs, FAO,UNDP, and ILO under United Nations Joint Programme (UNJP) has initiated Mt Sinabung Recovery Support Programme. The programme is funded by New Zealand Aid and channelled through Indonesia Multi-Donor Fund Facility for Disaster Recovery/Indonesia Disaster Fund (IMDFF-DR/IDF). The joint programme outcome is that communities affected by the 2013 – 2014 Mt. Sinabung eruption recover with sustainable livelihoods and enhanced resilience..

The output of the programme will be following:

- 1. The capacities of national and local authorities to coordinate post post-disaster early recovery and recovery measures are strengthened.
- 2. The capacities of national and local authorities to plan and implement post-disaster recovery activities are strengthened.
- 3. Rapid restoration of livelihoods and development of economic opportunities.
- 4. Risk-reduction principles incorporated in recovery measures.
- 5. FAO in coordination with relevant counterpart will mainly work to ensure the implementation of Output 3 and 4

Objectives:

During the inception phase of the project, the Project Inception Report Consultant will develop an Inception Report that incorporates the results of the baseline survey, a monitoring and evaluation framework, a risk management plan, and necessary adjustment in the logical framework.

He/she will undergo below range of activities:

- Conduct baseline survey to provide baseline data and identify appropriate program intervention and its activities and performance indicators at output and outcome level using a range of methodologies including: desk study review, key informant interview, focus group discussion and field survey.
- Make sure that relevant baseline data are collected during the baseline survey;
- Establish clear identification of targets beneficiaries at output and outcome level;
- Setting up a Results-Based Monitoring and Evaluation framework, complete with budget and data collection and analysis plan;
- Prepare the inception report and submit the final inception report in collaboration with the National Project Managers
- Conduct inception workshop to identify key counterparts from local communities, local CSO, and government entities
- Perform other related activities as required in regards to the project inception.

Scope of Work:

The incumbent area of work will be in the affected Mt. Sinabung eruption areas in Karo District, North Sumatra, Indonesia. He/she will work under the overall supervision of FAO Representatives in Indonesia, with direct supervision from Assistant – FAO Representative (Programme), in technical coordination with International Operation Officer, and in collaboration of relevant UNJP personnel.

Deliverables:

- Inception proposal completed within four days and consist of assignment agreed by UN joint team. The proposal should
 include detailed methodology instruments (FGD questions, questionnaires, budget, and work plan). He/She may suggest
 adjustments to the instruments based on needs assessment.
- First draft of Inception Report: submitted to UNJP team and presented to IDF for necessary feedback.
- Full Final Inception Report: should be provided in English.
